

Border-to-Border (B2B) Trail

Washtenaw County, including a portion of Superior Township, MI



The Border-to-Border Trail is envisioned to be a continuous 35-mile shared-use paved path for non-motorized use traversing Washtenaw County, from Livingston County to Wayne County, along the Huron River. The trail links the open spaces of the Huron River greenway, providing opportunities for transportation, recreation, and river access. The trail is being completed in 13 segments over a ten-year period. The completed segment in Superior Township runs past Washtenaw Community College on Huron River Drive, then wraps around the St. Joseph Mercy Hospital complex on McAuley Drive. It also includes an unpaved path with a scenic observation deck.

Bring your bike, roller blades, or walking shoes and enjoy your exploration!

To get here from the Superior Township Hall (3040 N. Prospect Rd.):

- Turn LEFT (south) on Prospect Rd. (2.1 miles)
- Turn RIGHT (west) on Geddes Rd. (1.8 miles)
- Turn LEFT (south) on Superior Rd. (1.2 miles)
- Turn RIGHT (west) on Huron River Dr. (0.5 miles)
- Turn RIGHT (north) on McAuley Dr. (0.7 miles)

Look for the B2B trail map/information stations on your right

NOTE: The B2B Trail map is available free of charge at the Parks & Recreation Administration offices or the Meri Lou Murray Recreation Center, both can be accessed from Platt Road near Washtenaw Avenue in Ann Arbor.
