

Dixboro Village in Superior Township

Plymouth Road at Cherry Hill Road, Dixboro, MI 48105

Dixboro Village is an unincorporated community within Superior Township. Located in the northwest corner of the township, the settlement was founded by Captain John Dix in 1824.



Dixboro School, the first of two historic buildings on the Village Green, is visible from the intersection of Plymouth Road and Cherry Hill Road. Built in 1888, the building is a fine example of the one-room schools of the era. It remained in use until 1953.

Directly behind the school on the square is the Dixboro United Methodist Church, sponsor of the annual Dixboro Fair. The church building, erected in 1858, is included in the National Register of Historic Places.



Just across Plymouth Road, the Dixboro General Store faces the school and the church. Built around 1840, the store completes the trio of buildings that form the village center.



To get here from the Superior Township Hall (3040 N. Prospect Rd.):

Turn RIGHT (north) on Prospect Rd. (0.9 mile)

Turn LEFT (west) on Ford Rd. (1.2 miles)

Turn LEFT (southwest) on Plymouth-Ann Arbor Rd. (1.9 miles)
